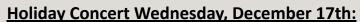

Healthy Food Policy

HRCE has a Healthy Food Policy in place to support healthy food choices. This policy allows a predetermined number of times a school can distribute treats to students. Therefore there are no other times that treats can be distributed either school wide or in individual classrooms. During the school year we often are contacted by parents/guardians requesting permission to send in things like cupcakes, candy or other treats to their child's classroom. Due to the Healthy Food Policy these requests will not be accommodated. Thank you for your cooperation.

Birthday Celebrations

Students look forward celebrating their birthdays with friends they have made at school. We would like to remind families that these social events are separate from the school and are to be coordinated outside of school time. We ask that if parents /guardians plan to distribute invitations at school to please coordinate with their teacher to do so discreetly. Additionally we do not allow the distribution of treat bags or party favors here at school. Thank you for your cooperation.

Student Early Pick Up

When you are picking up a student early, please come to the main entrance and use the intercom to be let in. Please proceed to the main office to request the student you are picking up. At this time we will call the student being picked up out of class and you can sign them out on the sign out sheet. Please arrive with enough time to allow students to be called from class and get ready. Please do not phone ahead of time. Thank you.

Water Bottles & Cutlery

Please remember to pack forks, spoons and a full water bottle daily. Thank you.

Dress for the Weather

This time of year weather can be unpredictable. Students go outside multiple times a day, even when the ground is wet. Please ensure student have splash/snow pants to stay dry. We recommend that student have a change of clothes in a large zipper seal bag in their backpack incase they are needed.

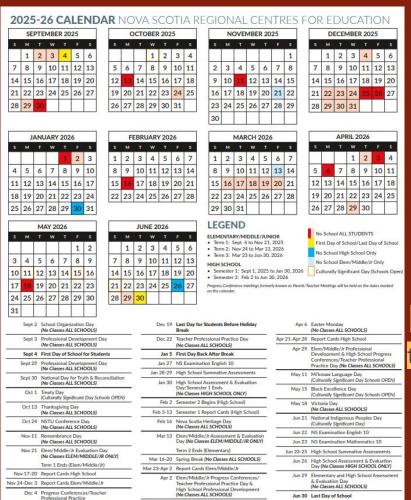

Planning for Inclement Weather

Did you know? HRCE takes great care when making the decision to alter the regular operations of schools and school buses in the event of severe or inclement weather. It is HRCE's goal to communicate any changes to the regular operations of schools and/or buses as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. **A 6:00** a.m. announcement could be:

- All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours;
- All schools are open, but some or all busses are not operating for the day; or
- Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or
- · All schools are closed for the day.

If weather deteriorates, or is forecasted to worsen throughout the morning, an 11:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- Bussed students will be picked up two hours earlier than their regular dismissal time; and
- Walking students will be dismissed at their regularly scheduled lunch hour.

How will I find out?

It's important to always have a plan in place for childcare in the event of any cancellation. Please remember: As a parent or guardian you always have the choice of whether or not to send your child to school.

Ten Rules for Raising Kids in a High-Tech World by Jean Twenge offers practical, actionable guidance to help parents set healthy boundaries and support their kids' digital wellbeing.

For kids: The Amazing Generation, written for pre-teens and teens and co-authored by Jonathan Haidt, will be released on December 30. It explains the impact of today's digital environment in an engaging, age-appropriate way.
